RON PELLETIER

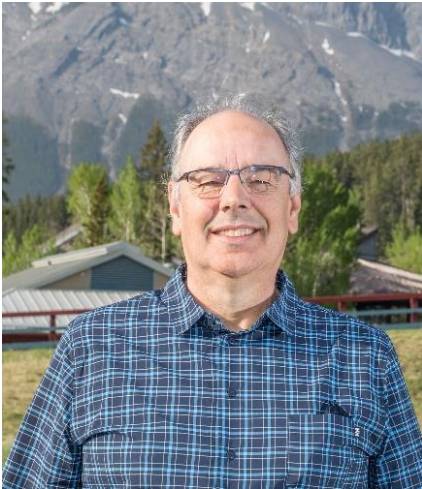
