**Schedule and classes may change due to weather conditions and number of competitors.

The organizing committee reserves the right to change the event schedule as needed. Every effort will be made to alert participants of any changes through Biathlon Alberta and social media pages.

Penalties:

- Mass Start: Air Rifle 1, Air Rifle 2, Dev 1 and Dev 2 ski a 100m penalty loop. All other classes ski a 150 m penalty loop.
- Sprint: Air Rifle 1, Air Rifle 2, Dev 1 and Dev 2 ski a 100m penalty loop. All other classes ski a 150 m penalty loop.

Rifle Carrying:

- Dev 1, Dev 2 and Air Rifle categories athletes shall have their rifles placed on and removed from the firing line by their coaches.
- Senior Boys/Girls carry their rifles only on the range. Coaches are responsible to provide their own "rifle runners".

Host Community:

Hinton, Alberta is a community with a population of 10 000. It is situated 295km West of Edmonton and 500km North-West of Calgary in the Foothills of the Rocky Mountains. Since we are only a 45 minute drive from the Town of Jasper it is a given that many residents in Hinton move here for the outdoors. From Skiing to Snowmobiling, from hiking to all-terrain vehicles there is an outdoor activity that suites all tastes.

The Venue:

The Hinton Nordic Centre has been on highway 40 (North) since 1984. The Hinton Nordic Centre was designed with the premise that we would be regularly hosting various biathlon and cross-country competitions. Our centre boasts 35km of expertly groomed trails and a biathlon range with 27 targets. As we are at the mercy of the varying mountain temperatures you might see the day time temperatures vary from -15 to +5 during your visit. Maps of the trails will be provided upon arrival and posted at the main lodge. This year in preparation for the 2020 Nor Am Cup and Calforex Cup we have worked hard at upgrading various parts of the course and range. Enjoy!

How to get to Hinton (Athabasca Lookout) Nordic Centre:

- Head west out of Hinton on Hwy 16 (Jasper direction)
- Turn right (north) on Hwy 40 (Grande Cache direction)
- Watch for the sign, about 10 km after turn on to Hwy 40
- Turn left off of Hwy 40 at Nordic Centre signage
- Once on the gravel road, take the first right
- For safety reasons, please back in to parking space

Registration:

On line registration will be available through www.Zone4.ca. Payments must be made using a credit card (VISA or Master Card) and on line charges will apply. Registration closes on Wednesday March 4, 2020 at 23:59 MST. There will be no registrations taken on site. All competitors must be a member of a Division or State to compete. Proof of membership is required to compete.

Cancellation Policy:

If an event is cancelled or postponed prior to the competition due to anticipated or prevailing weather conditions, competitors will receive a 50% refund of registration fees. If competitions are cancelled on the weekend of the event due to cold weather, course conditions, or other unforeseen circumstances, no refund of registration fees will be made.

Awards Banquet:

The Awards Banquet will be held Saturday evening, March 7, at the **Royal Canadian Legion, Hinton Branch 249** for competitors, family members, volunteers and friends. Presentation for individual awards for Saturday race will be held during the evening.

Eligibility to Compete:

All Registered Participants of Biathlon Canada Divisions, correctly registered by their Divisions, are eligible to participate in the classes as authorized by the Biathlon Canada Hosting Policy. Competitors from all IBU member NFs are eligible to participate in NAC events. Competitors must be prepared to show a membership card or otherwise demonstrate proof of such membership in the USBA or Biathlon Canada for the current year as part of the event registration and entry process regardless of the location of the event. Athletes who are Biathlon Canada *Registered Participants* must have in their possession, and be prepared to show to the Organizer upon request, their *Possession and Acquisition License (PAL)* or their *Minor's Permit*, which are firearms licenses issued by the Government of Canada.

Rifle/ Ammo Regulations:

Teams and individual competitors from outside of Canada must declare their rifles and ammunition at the Canadian border, complete the necessary documentation and pay the required fee when bringing their rifles and ammunition into Canada. All Competitors must comply with Canadian firearms laws and their provincial/territorial firearms regulations.

Other:

Water: Please ensure you bring sufficient water for the day. **There will only be minimal amount of drinking water on site.**

Waxing: We have limited waxing facilities on site. Plug-ins can also be found around the main chalet. No wax benches are available.

Competition Office: Located in the timing hut across from the main chalet will be open on Saturday March 7 at 9:00 a.m. and Sunday March 8 at 8:00 a.m.

Stadium and Race Course Maps: Will be provided at the Captain's meeting, and will be posted at the Nordic Centre Chalet for viewing.

Captain's Meeting: The Captain's Meeting will be held at the **École Mountain View School** at 7:00pm, Friday, January 10.

École Mountain View School: Located at 141 McLeod Ave.

Meals: There will be a cash only canteen on site during both race days.

Volunteer Check-In: Volunteers can be directed to the range for sign in and instruction for that days race.
